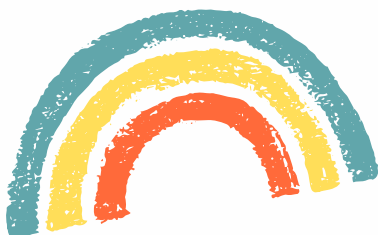
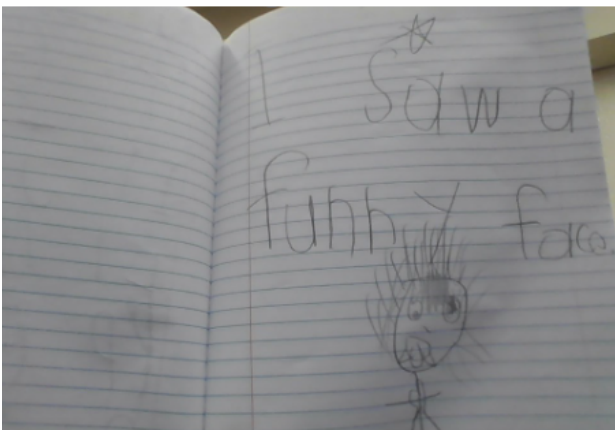
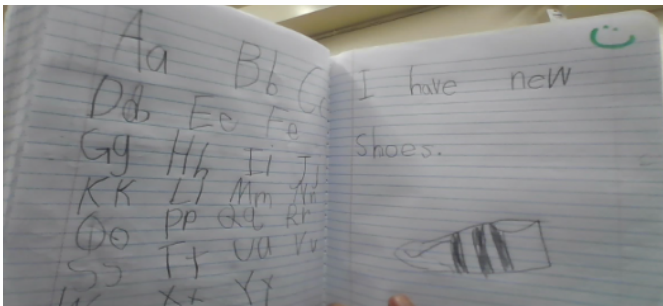

Math

The 7th graders will be reviewing concepts that we have covered in the past year to prepare for the Summative Assessment this month. I also plan on conducting a couple of math projects to finish the school year out, which I hope the students will enjoy.

ELA

I began our end of the year poetry unit for the 4th quarter. We will be diving into parts of poetry such as, alliteration, assonance, similes, metaphors, etc. Students will also be given the opportunity to write their own poems, like free verse, haikus, hyperbole, limericks, etc. Poetry is an important form of creative writing that centers around the expression of complex feelings and experiences. Reading poetry helps children appreciate simple ideas through figurative language and gain a deeper understanding of stories outside of their own life experiences. By providing a window into the thoughts of others, poetry has the power to provide a new perspective of the human experience.

We also began reading, *A Wrinkle in Time*, together and so far, the students are enjoying the book. *A Wrinkle in Time* is one of the great works of literature for kids. Besides being an exciting story, its messages of individuality, friendship, and courage have inspired generations of readers. This is a wonderful book for kids who've ever felt "different" or lonely or who have wrestled with loss. It celebrates the power of individuality, bravery, and love.
